




The CNOs should be notified about the issues which will be discussed prior to the meeting






The issues discussed during the previous meeting should be included in the agenda of the next meeting






It should be beneficial to include visits to hospitals during the CNOs meeting






It would be beneficial to include visits to research areas or other interesting scientific areas during the CNOs meeting






The active participation of the EFN in the CNOs meeting is important






The active participation of WHO in the CNOs Meeting is important






International issues should be discussed during CNOs Meeting

Question 9: In your opinion what would be the appropriate duration of the CNOs meeting and the duration of each session of the meeting
